#### **MINUTES**

Durant called the meeting of the Iowa Northland Regional Transportation Authority (RTA) Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) Committee to order at 10:00 a.m.

The first item on the agenda was approval of the agenda. It was moved by Harter, seconded by Hendrickson to approve the agenda as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

Next on the agenda was a work session to develop the draft Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) for the FY 2023-2026 Transportation Improvement Program.

a. Updates for projects currently programmed

Durant said three projects from Waverly, Buchanan County, and Black Hawk County Conservation are already programmed in the TAP. Black Hawk County Conservation requested to remove their project which is programmed was programmed with \$210,000 in FY 2024; Hendrickson said the scope of the project changed substantially. Cherry said the Waverly project has been moved to FY 2023 and the project will be bid in November with construction taking place in spring. Keierleber said the Buchanan County project is on track.

b. Presentations by new project sponsors

Durant said engineering fees are not permissible as part of project costs. All engineering costs have been removed from the total costs reflected in the spreadsheet.

i. Buchanan County Conservation - Fontana Park Trails Loop

Total cost: \$181,417, TAP request: \$145,133

FY 2024

This project paves a ten-foot wide, 0.5-mile paved concrete trail system, with loops guiding users through a new Prairie and Bison Learning Center, a lake-side campground, nature center, live animal displays, and other current and future park features. The trail makes connections to the existing paved Fontana Trail that extends along a lake shore with fishing jetties, and to the town of Hazelton.

ii. Butler County Conservation - Rolling Prairie Trail Extension

Total cost: \$634,617, TAP request: \$500,000

FY 2025

The project seeks to expand the Rolling Prairie Trail from Cedar Ave in the city limits of Dumont to the western Butler/Franklin County line. The project will include clearing, preparing, and placing a hard surface consisting of either concrete or asphalt on the former railroad bed. The length of the expansion is approximately 11,283 feet (2.14 miles). Franklin County is currently working on securing funds to pave the trail from the Butler/Franklin County line west to Hampton.

iii. Fairbank – Walk Safe Fairbank

Total cost: \$102,431, TAP request: \$81,947

FY 2023

This project will install a five-foot-wide sidewalk between Cedar Dr and Rhonda Rd within city limits where no current sidewalk exists. The project would connect the newest additions on the northeast side of town to the community and the school and provide more walking paths in town.

iv. Grundy County Conservation – Pioneer Trail

Total cost: \$249,579, TAP request: \$199,656

FY 2023

The proposed project is to overlay the existing limestone bike trail from Grundy Center to Holland with three inches of asphalt.

v. Independence – Enterprise Drive Trail Phase II

Total cost: \$442,000, TAP request: \$186,000

FY 2026

The project seeks to pave approximately 0.7 miles of pedestrian/bicycle trail connecting the City's current trail system to the retail commercial district along the Hwy 150 – Enterprise Dr corridor in the southern part of Independence.

vi. Janesville - Maple Street Trail

Total cost: \$922,980, TAP request: \$501,627

FY 2025

The project seeks to complete a multi-use trail from the 7th St Bridge, which is soon to be replaced, to Barrick Rd with railroad crossing and signals.

vii. La Porte City – Anton Trail

Total cost: \$492,797, TAP request: \$394,000

FY 2026

The project seeks to complete a multi-use trail from Bluff St at West Main St heading north to East Reinbeck Rd at Highway 218.

# viii. Waverly – Ivanhoe Bridge Replacement

Total cost: \$348,000 TAP request: \$278,400

FY 2026

The project seeks to replace one of eight bridges along the Rolling Prairie Trail that Waverly owns and maintains. The bridge is in poor condition and needs to be replaced to avoid future gaps in the trail network. The trail bridge also currently lacks adequate room for vehicle traffic or farm equipment to pass underneath. Bridge replacement will provide greater lateral clearance and ensured access to the Rolling Prairie Trail.

#### c. Candidate project ranking

Durant explained that the DOT allows the group to borrow ahead TAP funds so long as the last year of the program reflects a positive balance. Staff tallied the results and the group decided to remove projects one by one, using the rankings, until the program was balanced in FY 2026. Project rankings were as follows:

#### d. Programming of TAP projects

Five of the eight projects were removed, leaving the following projects in order: Walk Safe Fairbank, Fontana Park Trail, and Rolling Prairie Trail expansion. Available funding for the latter was \$15,500 below the project request. Butler County Conservation accepted the available funding. The program reflected a balance of \$47 in FY 2026.

e. Review and consider approval of the recommended TAP projects for submittal to the Policy Board

It was motioned by Keierleber, seconded by Kurtz to approve the recommended TAP projects for submittal to the Policy Board as follows:
